



Parking

The City of Calgary has Traffic Bylaws in place to ensure that Recreational Vehicles and specified Commercial Vehicles are not parked/stored in the front yard or driveway of any property. They will require the make, model and license plate number.

Definition of a Recreational Vehicle – motor-homes, campers, trailers, quads, boats, etc.

What is the law for Recreational Vehicles?

- Detached trailers and campers cannot be parked on city streets or alleys.
- Recreational Vehicles can be parked on a street immediately adjacent to the owner's residence, for a maximum of 36 hours.
- Recreational Vehicles can be parked on private driveways, for up to 24 hours.
- Parked Recreational Vehicles cannot block the view of intersections, crosswalks, playgrounds or signs.
- Parked Recreational Vehicles cannot obstruct the movement of other vehicles.

If you need to store your Recreational Vehicle for a long period of time, consult the phone book for a list of storage facilities. If it is stored on the property, it must be screened to reduce unattractive visibility of such vehicles or equipment from abutting streets.

No Recreational Vehicles will be allowed to be stored at 5 Panatella Square NW and 547 Panatella Square NW.

A motor vehicle which is in a dilapidated condition shall not be allowed to remain outside a building in a residential district. A commercial vehicle of a gross weight in excess of 4000 kilograms shall not be allowed to remain on a lot except while actively engaging in loading or unloading.
